Legislative Study

The projected costs to fund the general operating expenses of the Study Commission Regarding Liveable Wages are \$3,700 in fiscal year 2005-06. The Legislature's Part I budget includes \$30,000 in fiscal year 2005-06 and \$20,000 in fiscal year 2006-07 for legislative studies. Whether the amounts are sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature.

Additional costs to the Department of Labor, the Department of Economic and Community Development, and the Department of Health and Human Services associated with serving on the Commission can be absorbed utilizing existing budgeted resources.
