	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the
2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after
	adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
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	Whereas, this resolve establishes the Study Commission
6	Regarding Liveable Wages to define a liveable wage and study the
	issues confronting citizens of this State who earn less than a
8	liveable wage; and
10	Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day
	period expires in order that the study may be completed and a
12	report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative
	session; and
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	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
16	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
18	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
	safety; now, therefore, be it
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	Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Study
22	Commission Regarding Liveable Wages, referred to in this resolve
	as "the commission," is established; and be it further
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	Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission
26	consists of the following members appointed as follows:
28	1 Two Constant appointed by the Dresident of the Constant
40	 Two Senators appointed by the President of the Senate;
30	2. Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by
30	the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

Resolved: That the first-named Senate member 24 is the Senate chair of the commission and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; 26 and be it further 2.8 Sec. 4. Appointments: convening of commission. Resolved: 30 all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all 32 appointments have been completed. Within 15 days appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the 34 first meeting of the commission; and be it further 36 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the issues surrounding liveable wages. In conducting its review, the commission shall undertake to: 40 Define what level of compensation constitutes a liveable 42 wage; 44 Identify ways to ensure that all Maine adults earn a liveable wage; 46

that would enable working families to meet their basic needs;

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3. Examine the efficacy of a state earned income tax credit

- 4. Examine how increased access to education and training and access to child care increases the likelihood of earning a liveable wage and identify means of increasing such access;
 - 5. Identify the number of people in Maine who earn less than a liveable wage; and
- 6. Examine how state policies and payments, including
 10 MaineCare and other state health care related payments,
 contribute to the number of Mainers who earn less than a liveable
 12 wage; and be it further

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- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further
- 18 Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per 20 diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 22 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the Public members not otherwise compensated by their 24 employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses 26 and, demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the 28 legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further
 - Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than November 2, 2005, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature. The commission is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature at the time of submission of its report; and be it further
 - Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further
 - Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the

	commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from
2	the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council
4	shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a
4	status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.
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	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
8	preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
