22	This amendment increases the requirements for consideration
	for a waiver of the postgraduate training requirements for
24	licensure as a physician in this State from a minimum of 2 years
	of working experience to at least 3 years of clinical experience
26	in the area of expertise. It also provides that once the Board of
	Licensure in Medicine has determined that the physician has met
28	the basic requirements for consideration of a waiver, it shall
20	consider physicians that have completed a 3-year clinical
30	fellowship in the area of expertise. The burden of proof is placed on the applicant to prove the quality and content of the
32	fellowship. It also requires the board to consider publication

Additional costs to the Board of Licensure in Medicine, affiliated with the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, to waive the postgraduate training requirements for licensure in the State can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
