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42 This bill allows the Board of Licensure in Medicine, under exceptional circumstances, to waive the postgraduate training 44 requirements for licensure as a physician in this State. The physician must be a graduate of a foreign medical school, not 46 including a school in Canada or Great Britain, be licensed in another state and have at least 2 years working experience in the 48 area of expertise. If the physician meets these requirements, the board must consider the physician for a waiver using criteria

such as the completion of a fellowship, academic employment in a medical school in the United States and the number of years in practice.

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
