12 This amendment changes the title and replaces the bill with The amendment requires the Drinking Water Program 14 the Department of Health and Human Services, consultation with the Department of Environmental Protection, the Department of Conservation, Maine Geological Survey and the 16 Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to submit a 18 report to the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources by February 1, 2006. The report must address whether additional 20 requirements are needed for source water protection in Maine and describe recommended options to address those needs. 22 amendment also authorizes the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources to report out legislation to the Second Regular Session 24 of the 122nd Legislature requiring the Drinking Water Program to establish a process to allow public comment and to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 26 natural resources matters with subsequent any recommendations after consideration of the comments. 28
