24 Amend the bill in section 3 by striking out all of paragraph  
26 O (page 1, lines 23 to 26 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the  
following:

28 'O. An electronic mail address of an individual collected  
30 by a municipality if the individual requests that it not be  
disclosed separately or as part of a database or other  
aggregation of data.'

36 This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing
