**Sec. 1. Augusta bridge naming committee established. Resolved:**

2 That there is established the Augusta Bridge Naming Committee,  
referred to in this resolve as "the committee," with the purpose  
4 of naming the new Augusta bridge that crosses the Kennebec River  
north of the Father Curran Bridge. The committee is composed of  
6 the Augusta legislative delegation, the mayor of Augusta, 3  
members of the Augusta City Council, appointed by the mayor, and  
8 a resident of Kennebec County who represents regional interests  
in naming the bridge, appointed by the member of the Augusta  
10 legislative delegation who is a member of the Senate. The  
committee shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on  
12 Transportation with a proposed name for the bridge no later than  
December 7, 2005. Following receipt and review of the report,  
14 the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation may report out a  
bill to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature.

**SUMMARY**

This resolve establishes the Augusta Bridge Naming  
Committee, composed of the Augusta legislative delegation, the  
22 mayor and 3 city councilors of Augusta and a resident of Kennebec  
County. The committee is charged with proposing a name for the  
24 new Augusta bridge to the Joint Standing Committee on  
Transportation no later than December 7, 2005.
