An Act To Improve Funding for Telecommunications Relay Services

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §7104, sub-§6 is enacted to read: 4 6. Telecommunications relay services support. In order to 6 ensure the affordability of telecommunications relay services throughout the State, the commission shall establish funding 8 support for telecommunications relay services, including related outreach programs, within the state universal service fund 10 established pursuant to subsection 3. 12 A. In establishing the total level of support for the state universal service fund, the commission shall include funding levels for telecommunications relay services as recommended 14 by the Telecommunications Relay Services Advisory Council, 16 as established in section 8704, unless the commission determines, upon its own motion or upon the request of a 18 provider of intrastate telecommunications services, that the recommended funding levels may be unreasonable. If the commission determines that the funding levels may be 20 unreasonable, the commission shall open a proceeding to 22 determine a reasonable funding level for telecommunications relay services, including related outreached programs. Upon 24 the conclusion of the proceeding, the commission shall establish funding support for telecommunications relay services, including related outreach programs, that it has 26 found to be reasonable within the state universal service fund. The commission shall require contributions to the 28 state universal service fund on a quarterly basis to meet 30 the established funding support levels. In determining reasonable funding levels for 32 в. telecommunications relay services, including related outreach programs, the commission may consider whether the 34 recommended funding is for telecommunications relay services, including related outreach programs, that are: 36 38 (1) Federally required services; (2) Services provided in other states with a similar 40 deaf, hard-of-hearing and speech impaired population as this State; or 42 (3) Services that are designed to maximize the 44 effectiveness of telecommunications relay services through the application of new technologies. 46 Sec. 2. 35-A MRSA §8703, sub-§7, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 48 851, $\S7$, is amended to read: 50

7. Recovery of expenses and costs. The costs for
2 telecommunications relay services must be recovered in-the-same manner-as-any-other-costs-for-the-provision-of-services-by-local

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SUMMARY

12 This bill is designed to move the funding source for telecommunications relay services from its current embedded 14subsidy in local exchange carrier bills into the state universal service fund so that it will be funded equally by all intrastate 16 telecommunications providers. The bill also clarifies that the Relay Services Advisory Council Telecommunications is the appropriate body for forming funding level requirements, and the 18 Public Utilities Commission is the appropriate body for authorizing collection and payment of such funding levels. 20
