Resolve, To Study the Citizen Initiative Process

Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force to Study the Citizen Initiative Process, referred to in this resolve 2 as "the task force," is established; and be it further 4 Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of 8 members appointed as follows: 6 1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of 8 the Senate; 10 2. Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and 12 3. Four members appointed by the Governor: 14 16 A. One member representing a statewide organization with experience in opposition to a citizen initiative; 18 в. One member representing a consulting group or business 20 that offers referendum campaign services; C. One member representing a citizens' group that initiated 22 by petition a proposal that was enacted by the Legislature 24 or by the people of the State in referendum; and 26 D. One member representing the general public; and be it further 28 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall 30 serve as chair of the task force; and be it further Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of task force. Resolved: That all 32 appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall 34 notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after 36 appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force; and be it further 38 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall hold 40 meetings at various locations in the State, to be determined by the chair. The task force shall develop a proposal with any 42 suggested changes to the citizen initiative process; and be it further 44

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force; and be it further

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Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the task force are entitled to receive the legislative per 6 diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses 8 2, related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the task Public members not otherwise compensated by their 10 force. employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to 12 receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the 14 legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than January 2, 18 2006, the task force shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, 20 for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd introduce force is authorized Legislature. The task to legislation related to its report to the task force at the time 22 of submission of its report; and be it further

Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the task force requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. Task force budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the 30 task force, with assistance from the task force staff, shall administer the task force's budget. Within 10 days after its 32 first meeting, the task force shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The 34 task force may not incur expenses that would result in the task 36 force's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the task force, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council 38 shall promptly provide the task force chairs and staff with a status report on the task force budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds. 40

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SUMMARY

This resolve establishes the Task Force to Study the Citizen 46 Initiative Process. The resolve also directs the task force to file its report by January 2, 2006.

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
