Resolve, To Establish the Commission to Study the Efficiency of State Business Assistance Services

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the become effective 2 Legislature do not until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 4 Whereas, this resolve establishes the Committee to Study the Efficiency of State Business Assistance Services; and 6 Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day 8 period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative 10 session; and 12 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 14 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 16 safety; now, therefore, be it 18 Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Efficiency of State Business Assistance Services, 20 referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; 22 and be it further Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission 24 consists of 8 members appointed as follows: 26 Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of 1. 28 the Senate: 30 Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed 2. by the Speaker of the House; 32 Two members representing small businesses with 50 or 3. 34 fewer employees, appointed by the President of the Senate; 36 4. One member representing large businesses with more than 50 employees, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and 38 The Commissioner of Economic and Community Development; 5. 40 and be it further Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member 42 is the Senate chair of the commission and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; 44 and be it further 46 Sec. 4. Appointments: convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 48 effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission; and be it further

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Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall:

8 1. Review, jointly with the Department of Economic and Community Development, all state-funded business assistance 10 services; and

 Report its recommendations for the streamlining, coordinating and packaging of services to enhance the delivery of state resources and expertise; and be it further

16 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis 18 shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per 22 diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses 24 related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Public members not otherwise compensated by their 26 employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to reimbursement of necessary expenses 28 receive and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the 30 legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 7, 34 2005, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Business, 36 Research and Economic Development and the Legislative Council. 38 The commission is not authorized to introduce legislation. Following receipt and review of the report, the Joint Standing Committee on Business, Research and Economic Development may 40 report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature. 42

The report must be included in the Department of Economic and Community Development's biennial report to the Governor
pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 13058, subsection 5; and be it further

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Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the 6 commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. 8 Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. 10 The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. 12 Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a 14 status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds. 16

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

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SUMMARY

24 This resolve creates the Commission to Study the Efficiency of State Business Assistance Services and directs the commission to submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Business, Research and Economic Development.
