8	Whereas, there is no one to assist the ATV operators in establishing trails to be used for ATVs; and
10	Whereas, it is necessary to have this legislation be an
12	emergency so that trails may be established as soon as possible; and
14	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
16	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
18	safety; now, therefore,
20	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

34	1. Appointment and composition. The ATV Trail Advisory
36	Council, referred to in this section as "the advisory council" and established by Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 3-C,
38	consists of 11 members. The director or the director's designee serves as an ex officio member and may vote only to break a tie.
40	The other 10 members are appointed by the commissioner as follows:
42	A. Three members who represent ATV clubs that are ATV Recreational Management Fund grantees;
44	B. Three members who represent municipal ATV Recreational
• -	Management Fund grantees;
46	C Two members who represent a statewide engagination with
48	C. Two members who represent a statewide organization with an interest in operating ATVs;
50	D. One member who represents ATV business interests; and

E. One member who represents landowner interests.

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- 4 2. Terms. Members of the advisory council serve for 3 years, except that initially the members appointed under subsection 1, paragraphs A, B and C shall draw lots for 2-year or 6 3-year terms. Members continue serving until a successor is duly 8 appointed and qualified. A member may not serve more than 2 consecutive 3-year terms. When a vacancy occurs, the 10 commissioner shall fill the vacancy by appointing a member from the same category as the member who vacated the advisory council and that member continues to serve for the remainder of the 12 term. An employee of the department may not serve as a member of 14 the advisory council prior to the expiration of one year from the employee's last day of employment with the department. A Legislator may not serve as a member of the advisory council. 16
- 18 3. Compensation. Advisory council members are entitled to reasonable expenses as provided in Title 5, chapter 379, as approved by the director.
- 4. Duties. The advisory council shall provide to the director advice and information on the management of the ATV Recreational Management Fund, including, but not limited to:
- A. The annual establishment of reimbursement rates for ATV club trail grants, municipal ATV trail grants and capital equipment grants; and
- B. Expenditures that are over \$30,000 for ATV activities pursuant to section 1893 and are not part of the regular grant program.
- 5. Chair: vice-chair. The advisory council shall, during its meeting in August, elect one of its appointed members as chair and one of its appointed members as vice-chair for one-year terms.
- 6. Meetings. The advisory council shall hold meetings in
 40 August and February. The advisory council may also meet at other
 times at the call of the chair or the director or the director's
 42 designee.
- 7. Public meetings; public comment. All meetings of the advisory council are open to the public and must be held in a location that is convenient for public access. Public comment must be accepted at meetings of the advisory council. Comments may be restricted to subjects before the advisory council at the meeting and consistent with any applicable requirements and limitations of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act.

	meetings must be in accordance with Title 1, section 406.
