	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the
2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after
4	adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
6	Whereas, the State has seen a dramatic rise in the amount of unsecured personal debt and the number of personal bankruptcies
	and recognizes the importance of educating Maine people in the
8	management of personal and family finances; and
10	Whereas, this resolve establishes the Commission to Study the Scope and Quality of Personal and Family Financial Management
12	Education; and
14	Whereas, this resolve is necessary as an emergency measure to afford adequate time for the issues to be appropriately
16	addressed by the commission; and
18	Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a
20	report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and
22	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
24	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
26	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it
28	Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission
30	to Study the Scope and Quality of Personal and Family Financial Management Education, referred to in this resolve as "the
32	commission," is established; and be it further
34	Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 11 members appointed as follows:
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38	1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate;
40	2. Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and
42	3. Seven members appointed by the Governor as follows:
44	A. One member who teaches personal finances in a Maine high
46	school or community college;

B. One representative of the Finance Authority of Maine;

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C. One representative of the Maine Bankers Association or the Maine Credit Union League; 2 D. One member with experience in curriculum development in 4 the field of personal and family financial management; 6 E. One member representing a nonprofit credit counseling 8 agency; F. One member representing a community action program or 10 similar nonprofit organization who has experience with the financial matters of low-income people; and 12 G. One member who is involved in teacher training for 14 financial education at the university level; and be it further 16 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member 18 is the Senate chair of the commission and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; 20 and be it further 22 Sec. 4. Appointments: convening of commission. Resolved: all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 24 effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all 26 completed. appointments have been Within 15 days appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the 28 first meeting of the commission; and be it further 30 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall examine: 32 The extent to which personal and family financial management is currently included in the visions, missions, values 34 and practices of school administrative units and institutions of higher education in the State; 36 38 2. National models for educational curricula that cover preschool through college with the potential for preparing 40 students in the State to be financially literate; 42 3. Models for making comprehensive personal and family financial management education available at the adult education, 44 community college or other postsecondary level; and 4. Strategies for integrating financial management education 46 social services programs to ensure that the 48 low-income residents receive skills training and education in financial management; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 3, 2005, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature. The commission is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature at the time of submission of its report; and be it further

Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

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This resolve establishes the Commission to Study the Scope and Quality of Personal and Family Financial Management Education.
