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	4. Meetings: assistance. The council shall meet at least 4
48	times per year and may meet at other times as necessary. All
F.O.	meetings of the council are public proceedings and all records
50	are public records as defined in Title 1, section 402,

subsections 2 and 3. The Governor's Office of Health Policy and Finance and the Department of Health and Human Services shall provide assistance and staff support to the council.

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SUMMARY

8 This bill establishes the Pharmacy Cost Management Council to develop and implement measures to control the cost of 10 prescription drugs and expand the State's purchasing power. The council is required to provide annual reports to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 12 health and human services matters and the joint standing jurisdiction 14 committee οf the Legislature having appropriations and financial affairs by March 1, 2006 and each 16 year thereafter. The meetings of the council and its records are public.
