| 26 | This bill creates the position of "public safety official" and provides this position with the authority to control traffic |
| 28 | in emergency situations. Failure to comply with the directions of a public safety official is an infraction for which the |
| 30 | registered owner of the vehicle is responsible unless proven otherwise. |
