Resolve, To Establish the Commission To Study Incentives That Foster Small Business Practices That Support the Economic Growth and Well-being of Maine People and Communities

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, this legislation establishes the Commission to Study Incentives that Foster Small Business Practices that Support the Economic Growth and Well-being of Maine People and Communities to develop strategies to encourage long-term positive practices between businesses, communities and the State; and

Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

- Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Incentives that Foster Small Business Practices that Support the Economic Growth and Well-being of Maine People and Communities, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following members appointed as follows:

1. Three Senators appointed by the President of the Senate, one of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Business, Research and Economic Development; one of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation; and one of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government;

- 2. Three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Business, Research and Economic Development; one of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation; and one of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government;
 - 3. The Commissioner of Labor or the commissioner's designee;
- 46 4. The Executive Director of the Bureau of Revenue Services within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, or the executive director's designee; and
- 5. The following members appointed by the Governor:

12	Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission:
14	and be it further
16	Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the
18	effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all
20	appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the
22	first meeting of the commission; and be it further
24	Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall review strategies and business supports that might be made available as
26	positive incentives to businesses in this State that actively implement traditional, fair and responsible business practices
28	and engage in activities that support the well-being of Maine communities by going beyond the bare minimum of complying with
30	the laws of the State. In conducting its review, the commission shall:
32	 Identify state practices and incentives that might be
34	employed to support such businesses in continuing such practices and create long-term positive business practices among
36	businesses, community and the State;
38	 Identify measurable business practice indicators that the State can use to determine if a business qualifies for

46	Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the
48	Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

- Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement necessary expenses of and, demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further
- Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 7, 2005, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature. The commission is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature at the time of submission of its report; and be it further
 - Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further
 - Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds; and be it further
 - Sec. 11. Outside funding. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission may seek and accept outside funding. Prompt notice of solicitation and acceptance of funds must be sent to the Legislative Council. All funds accepted must be forwarded to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council along with an accounting that includes amount, date received, from whom, purpose and limitation on use of the funds. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council administers any funds received. Expenses that have an effect on the General Fund may not be incurred by the commission.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

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SUMMARY

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This resolve establishes the Commission to Study Incentives that Foster Small Business Practices that Support the Economic Growth and Well-being of Maine People and Communities.
