Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §5515, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 2001, c. 261, §4, is amended to read:

6. Examination. Each applicant for a forester license shall submit an application and examination fee and successfully pass an examination administered by the board designed to test an individual's knowledge to engage in the practice of forestry. Applicants shall meet all other qualifications for licensure prior to taking the examination. The board shall make the examination available to applicants at least once a month.

Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §5516, sub-§2, ¶D is enacted to read:

D. The board shall issue a license to an applicant who is licensed in good standing in New Hampshire or Vermont.
