Resolve, To Develop a Statewide Entrepreneurship Curriculum from Kindergarten through College

Sec. 1. Commissioner of Education to develop entrepreneurship 2 curriculum to be implemented in schools from kindergarten to grade 12. **Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Education shall include in Δ the next review of the system of learning results, as required by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 6209, subsection 4, entrepreneurship education as a core content in the review of 6 the State's learning standards, including recommendations for the inclusion of entrepreneurial concepts and skills in the guiding 8 principles listed in Title 20-A, section 6209, subsection 1. The 10 review required in this section must consider the following desirable outcomes for students:

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The initiation of personal, community and business
 ventures;

2. The development of an awareness and understanding of the economic and personal factors that contribute to the success of
 entrepreneurial ventures; development of personal skills by initiating, planning and implementing an entrepreneurial venture;
 and development of communication skills; and

 3. The development of the ability to respond to changes in a business environment by requiring a practical approach that
 uses the potential of the student and that encourages the student to use opportunities based on informed risk taking and problem
 solving; and be it further

Sec. 2. University of Maine System and Maine Community College
 System to develop entrepreneurship curriculum to be implemented at
 college campuses. Resolved: That the University of Maine System
 and the Maine Community College System shall develop an
 entrepreneurship curriculum based on the factors described in
 section one of this resolve to be implemented at all the campuses
 and shall market community colleges as training centers for
 business owners and operators; and be it further

36 Sec. 3. Establishment of Entrepreneurship Education Task Force. That the Entrepreneurship Education Task Force is 38 **Resolved:** established and consists of the follow members: the Commissioner of Education, the Chancellor of the University of Maine System 40 and the President of the Maine Community College System. The Entrepreneurship Education Task Force shall report on the 42 progress of the development and implementation of entrepreneurial curricula in elementary, secondary and postsecondary schools in 44 the State to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs no later than February 1, 2006; and be it further 46

4. Maine Community College System to implement entrepreneurial 2 training program. Resolved: That the Maine Community College System shall implement a statewide entrepreneurship training program that covers key aspects of starting a business. The 4 entrepreneurship training program must include a series of б noncredit training seminars offered at all 7 of the Maine Community College System campuses. The entrepreneurship training program must be open to the public and provide for a 8 subsidy of 50% of the cost of tuition for qualified individuals and full and partial scholarships to make the program available 10 to the widest possible audience; and be it further.

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Sec. 5. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved: That the following appropriations and allocations are made.

SUMMARY

This resolve requires the Commissioner of Education to include entrepreneurship education principles in the next review 34 of the system of learning results and the Chancellor of the 36 University of Maine System and the President of the Maine College System to develop an entrepreneurship Community curriculum to be implemented at all University of Maine System 38 and Maine Community College System campuses and to market 40 community colleges as training centers for business owners and operators. This resolve also establishes the Entrepreneurship 42 Education Task Force comprised of the Commissioner of Education, Chancellor of the University of Maine System and the President of the Maine Community College System to report on the progress of 44 the development and implementation of entrepreneurship curricula 46 to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs no later than February 1, 2006.

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This resolve also directs the Maine Community College System 50 to implement a statewide entrepreneurship training program that covers key aspects of starting a business, and it includes an
 appropriation of \$370,000 over 2 years to fund the program and provide subsidies and scholarships to make the program available
 to the widest possible audience.
