An Act To Increase College Scholarships

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 8 MRSA §300, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 687, Pt. A, §4 and affected by Pt. B, §11, is repealed. 4 б Sec. 2. 8 MRSA §1036, sub-§§1 and 2, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 687, Pt. A, $\S5$ and affected by Pt. B, \$11, are amended to read: 8 1. Distribution for administrative expenses of board. Α 10 slot machine operator shall collect and distribute 1% 2% of adjusted gross slot machine income to the Treasurer of State for 12 deposit in the General Fund for the administrative expenses of the board. For purposes of this subsection, "adjusted gross slot 14 machine income" means the total value of money or tokens, credits or similar objects or things of value used to actually play a 16 slot machine before payback is distributed to a player. 18 2. Distribution from commercial track. A slot machine operator shall collect and distribute 39% 38% of the total gross 20 slot machine income from slot machines operated by the slot machine operator to the board for distribution by the board as 22 follows: 24 Α. Three percent of the total gross slot machine income must be deposited to the General Fund for administrative expenses 26 of the board, including gambling addiction counseling services, in accordance with rules adopted by the 28 board; 30 Β. Ten percent of the total gross slot machine income must be forwarded by the board to the Treasurer of State, who shall credit the money to the fund established in section 32 298 to supplement harness racing purses; 34 c. Three percent of the total gross slot machine income must be credited by the board to the Sire Stakes Fund 36 created in section 281; 38 Three percent of the total gross slot machine income D. 40 must be forwarded by the board to the Treasurer of State, who shall credit the money to the Agricultural Fair Support Fund established in Title 7, section 77; 42 44 Ε. Ten percent of the total gross slot machine income must be forwarded by the board to the State Controller to be credited to the Fund for a Healthy Maine established by 46 Title 22, section 1511 and segregated into a separate 48 account under Title 22, section 1511, subsection 11, with the use of funds in the account restricted to the purposes described in Title 22, section 1511, subsection 6, paragraph 50 Е;

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F. Two <u>and one-half</u> percent of the total gross slot machine income must be forwarded by the board to the University of
Maine System Scholarship Fund created in Title 20-A, section 11631;

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G. One <u>and one-half</u> percent of the total gross slot machine income must be forwarded by the board to the board of trustees of the Maine Community College System to be applied by the board of trustees to fund its scholarships program under Title 20-A, section 12716, subsection 1;

н. Four percent of the total gross slot machine income must be forwarded by the board to the Treasurer of State, who 14 shall credit the money to the Fund to Encourage Racing at 16 Maine's Commercial Tracks, established in section 299; however, the payment required by this paragraph is 18 terminated when all commercial tracks have obtained a license to operate slot machines in accordance with this 20 chapter; and

36 J. One percent of the total gross slot machine income must be forwarded directly to the municipality in which the slot 38 machines are located.

## **SUMMARY**

This bill repeals the laws that establish the Fund to 44 Stabilize Off-track Betting Facilities and require that 2% of the 46 bill provides that consistent with the intent of the Maine 46 Revised Statutes, Title 8, section 1036, subsection 2, paragraph 48 I, half of the money that otherwise would be deposited in the 49 Fund to Stabilize Off-track Betting Facilities is deposited in the General Fund for the administrative expenses of the Gambling
Control Board. The bill also provides that the other half of this money is divided equally between the University of Maine
System and the Maine Community College System for student scholarships.
