22	Amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the enacting clause the following:					
24	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not					
26	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and					
28	Whereas, the milk handling fee provided significant revenue					
30	to the State when it was in effect; and					
32	Whereas, the State is experiencing economic difficulties and significant fiscal problems; and					
34	Whereas, revenues are necessary to the State's ability to					
36	address issues vital to the well-being of the State; and					
38	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 996, L.D. 1432

SUMMARY

This amendment adds an emergency. It establishes a rate schedule that varies inversely with the price of milk and a 6 trigger for initiating the fee. The handling fee is initiated after the basic price of milk falls below \$18 per hundredweight 8 for 2 consecutive months. It adds definitions to the bill for "basic price" and "producer-handler." It provides an exception 10 from the fee for producer-handlers who sell less than 10,000 hundredweight per year. It allows the State Tax Assessor to 12 share information with the Maine Milk Commission. It also removes the provision relating to funding for the Maine Farms for 14 the Future Program.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The Milk Handling Fee may increase General Fund Revenue by an estimated \$1,200,000 in fiscal year 2005-06 and \$1,300,000 in fiscal year 2006-07. The actual amount of additional revenue may vary greatly from these estimates since the handling fee imposed is required to range from 0 cents per gallon to 12 cents per gallon depending on the price of milk, a variable that is difficult to predict with any certainity. This bill also includes a \$10,000 General Fund appropriation in fiscal year 2005-06 for the initial additional costs to Maine Revenue Services.
