Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 1 MRSA §435 is enacted to read:
§435. Listing of statutes
This section provides a list of statutes that designate

affect the public or confidential status of the records. Inclusion in or exclusion from a specific subsection of this
