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### **SUMMARY**

This amendment amends the definitions of "motorcycle" and 34 "moped" to include criteria for wheel size and electric powered motors. This amendment also clarifies that the definition of a 36 motor vehicle does not include an all-terrain vehicle unless the all-terrain vehicle is issued a special registration permit in 38 accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, section 501. The amendment also clarifies that an all-terrain vehicle is 40 not subject to licensing provisions under Title 29-A, chapter 11 unless the all-terrain vehicle is issued a special registration 42 permit in accordance with Title 29-A, section 501.

44 The amendment also reflects changes necessitated by laws enacted in the First Special Session of the 122nd Legislature.
