2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

20	Sec. 1. Committee established. Resolved: That the Committee to
22	Study the Establishment of a Memorial for Emergency Medical Services Personnel, referred to in this resolve as "the
24	committee," is established; and be it further See 2 Committee membership Poselved: That the committee
26	Sec. 2. Committee membership. Resolved: That the committee consists of 9 members appointed as follows:
28	1. One member of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate;
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32	2. Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House;
34	3. Three Maine emergency medical services licensed personnel of different license levels appointed by the Director of Maine
36	Emergency Medical Services;
38	4. One representative of the Maine Emergency Medical Services Memorial Fundraising Project appointed by the project;
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42	5. One representative of the State House and Capitol Park Commission appointed by that commission; and
44	6. One representative of the Capitol Planning Commission appointed by that commission; and be it further
46	Sec. 3. Chair. Resolved: That the Senate member of the
48	committee is the chair of the committee; and be it further

Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of committee. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chair shall call and convene the first meeting of the committee; and be it further

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- Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the committee shall study issues and make recommendations regarding the establishment of a memorial to honor emergency medical services personnel who have fallen in the line of duty and others who have made significant contributions to the development of the statewide Maine emergency medical services system, including, but not limited to:
- 16 1. Where specifically within the area reserved in section 12 of this resolve the memorial should be located;
 - 2. What should be inscribed on the memorial;
 - 3. The design of the memorial; and

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4. The cost of establishing and maintaining the memorial and the process of fund-raising to ensure that no state funds will be required; and be it further

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- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the committee; and be it further
- Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the committee are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the committee. Other members of the committee not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary
- expenses and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at
- 42 authorized meetings of the committee; and be it further
- Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than January 14, 2006, the committee shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety and the Legislative Council. The committee is authorized to introduce legislation related to its

report to the Second Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature at the time of submission of its report; and be it further

Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the committee requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

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Sec. 10. Funding. Resolved: That the committee shall seek outside funds to fully fund all costs of the committee. If sufficient outside funding has not been received by August 15, 2005 to fully fund all costs of the committee, no meetings are authorized and no expense of any kind may be incurred or reimbursed. Contributions to support the work of the committee may not be accepted from any party having a pecuniary or other vested interest in the outcome of the matters being studied. Any person, other than a state agency, desiring to make a financial or in-kind contribution must certify to the Legislative Council that it has no pecuniary or other vested interest in the outcome The certification must be made in the manner of the study. prescribed by the Legislative Council. All contributions are subject to approval by the Legislative Council. All funds accepted must be forwarded to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council along with an accounting record that includes the amount of funds, the date the funds were received, from whom the funds were received and the purpose of and any limitation on The Executive Director the use of those funds. οf Legislative Council administers any funds received by committee. The executive director shall notify the chair of the committee when sufficient funding has been received; and be it further

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Sec. 11. Committee budget. Resolved: That the chair of the committee, with assistance from the committee staff, shall administer the committee's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the committee shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The committee may not incur expenses that would result in the committee's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the committee, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the committee chair and staff with a status report on the committee budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds; and be it further

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Sec. 12. Maine Emergency Medical Services Memorial: space reserved. Resolved: That space must be reserved for the Maine Emergency Medical Services Memorial in the area of the State House grounds adjacent to the 2 existing memorials for firefighters and law enforcement personnel.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

This resolve establishes the Committee to Study the Establishment of a Memorial for Emergency Medical Services Personnel. The resolve directs the committee to study issues and make recommendations regarding the establishment of a memorial to honor emergency medical services personnel who have fallen in the line of duty and others who have made significant contributions to the development of the statewide Maine emergency medical services system. The resolve also directs that space be set aside for the Maine Emergency Medical Services Memorial in the area of the State House grounds adjacent to the memorials to firefighters and law enforcement personnel.
