C. Advises nonprofit entities, authors, media and others who publish materials about recreational trails to ascertain whether or not a trail crosses private property and encourages them to obtain written permission to publish information about such a trail from the landowner; and

D. Helps prevent unauthorized publication of information about recreational trails located on private property; and be it further

Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Conservation shall jointly provide the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife a report regarding the program and its implementation pursuant to this resolve no later than January 2, 2006.

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill, which is a concept draft, with a resolve. It requires the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Conservation to work with the Executive Department, State Planning Office, landowners and other interested parties to develop and implement a program that ensures that publications regarding recreational trails that cross private property are authorized by the affected landowner, notifies readers that the trail crosses private property and encourages trail users to be respectful of private property. It also requires the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Conservation to jointly report to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife regarding the program and its implementation no later than January 2, 2006.
