	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the
2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
4	Whereas, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375,
6	subchapter 2-A requires legislative authorization before major substantive agency rules may be finally adopted by the agency; and
8	Whereas, the above-named major substantive rule has been
10	submitted to the Legislature for review; and
12	Whereas, immediate enactment of this resolve is necessary to record the Legislature's position on final adoption of the rule;

16	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
18	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
20	safety; now, therefore, be it
22	Sec. 1. Adoption. Resolved: That final adoption of Chapter 920: Maine Model Building Energy Code, a provisionally adopted
24	major substantive rule of the Public Utilities Commission that has been submitted to the Legislature for review pursuant to the
26	Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A, is authorized.
