	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §682, sub-§2, as repealed and replaced by PI
4	2003, c. 447, §22, is amended to read:
6	2. Influence prohibited. Within 250 feet of the entrance to the voting place as well as within the voting place itself, a
8	person may not:
10	A. Influence another person's decision regarding a candidate or ballot issue; or
12	canazade or Barrot Islae, or
	B. Attempt to influence another person's decision regarding
14	a candidate or ballot issue.
16	These limitations do not prohibit a candidate from attending the voting place and erally-communicating with-veters voting as long
18	as the candidate does not attempt to influence their the vote of others. A candidate may not state the name of the office sought
20	or request a person's vote.
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	SUMMARY
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	This hill limits a candidato's activities at nolling places

to voting.

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
