	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2921, sub-§8-A is enacted to read:

8	teletypewriter or other telecommunications equipment used by deaf, hard-of-hearing or speech-impaired persons to conduct

12	Sec. 2. 25 MRSA §2926, sub-§2, $\P$ B, as amended by PL 2001, c. 439, Pt. EEEE, §3, is further amended to read:
14	B. Development of minimum public safety answering point
16	requirements including 24-hour operation; emergency backup power; secured communication areas; separate administrative phone lines for nonemergency calls; call recording and
18	playback equipment; TDD equipment, -as-defined in Title-35-A, seetien-8702, - subsection -6; the ability to accept a call
20	generated by an automated emergency response telephone; maximum call handling times; and minimum mandatory staff
22	training requirements for E-9-1-1 call answering and dispatching, including training on voice carry-over, hearing
24	carry-over and captioned telephones. TDD equipment and newly developed related equipment annually and upon the employment
26	of a dispatcher;
28	Sec. 3. 25 MRSA §2926, sub-§§7 and 8 are enacted to read:
30	<b>7. Random tests.</b> The bureau shall conduct an unannounced TDD call test at least once a month for every public safety
32	answering point. The test must include outgoing and incoming calls and an equipment check, including the use of TDD, voice
34	carry-over, hearing carry-over and captioned telephone equipment. The bureau shall report the test results of all
36	public safety answering points to the E-9-1-1 Council and the Department of Labor, Bureau of Rehabilitation Services, Division
38	of Deafness.
40	<b>8. Compatibility.</b> The bureau shall ensure that a change to the statewide E-9-1-1 system that requires new equipment is
42	compatible with TDD, voice carry-over, hearing carry-over and captioned telephone equipment.

46	SUMMARY
48	This bill requires that the Emergency Services Communication Bureau:
50	1. Ensure that all public safety answering points accept
52	calls generated from automated emergency response telephones;

 2. Ensure that all dispatchers at public safety answering points are trained on telecommunications devices for the deaf and
4 voice carry-over, hearing carry-over and captioned telephone equipment as well as any newly developed related equipment;

Conduct monthly, unannounced call tests for every public
safety answering point to test call and equipment capability and to report the test results to the E-9-1-1 Council and the
Department of Labor, Bureau of Rehabilitation Services, Division of Deafness; and

Ensure that any change to the E-9-1-1 system that
requires new equipment is compatible with telecommunications devices for the deaf and voice carry-over, hearing carry-over and
captioned telephone equipment.
