10 Emergency alert telecommunications service; discount <u>6.</u> fund. This subsection applies to the extent funds are transferred from the General Fund to the Communications Equipment 12 Fund established in subsection 2 for the purposes of this 14 subsection. A person who has been certified by the Division of Deafness as being deaf or hard-of-hearing and has an income of less than 135% of the federal poverty level must receive a 16 discount of up to \$10 per month in the service charge for any wireless communications device or 2-way pager that is used to 18 receive emergency alerts issued by any state or federal agency. 20 Such a person must receive a \$10 discount except when the service charge for the wireless communications device or 2-way pager is 22 less than \$10 per month, in which case the person must receive a discount equal to the service charge for the wireless 24 communications device or 2-way pager. A company required to provide the discount is entitled to recover the discount amount 26 from the Communications Equipment Fund. Administrative costs associated with implementing this subsection may be paid from 28 funds appropriated to the Communications Equipment Fund for the purposes of this subsection. The Bureau of Rehabilitation Services shall adopt rules to establish the process for 30 certifying eligibility with the Division of Deafness and for the process to be used by wireless and paging companies in recovering 32 discounted revenue from the Communications Equipment Fund. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules 34 as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. 36

5. Funds for Communications Equipment Fund.  2-way pagers incurred by deaf or hard-of-hearing persons eligible for discounts under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title
 section 1419-A, subsection 6 through appropriate bidding or other procedures to achieve bulk discounts on such charges.

SUMMARY

10 This amendment, which is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy, replaces the bill.
12 This amendment does the following:

 It provides to a deaf or hard-of-hearing person who has an income of less than 135% of the federal poverty level a
 discount of up to \$10 per month in the service charge for any wireless communications device or 2-way pager that is used to
 receive emergency alerts issued by any state or federal agency;

20 2. It provides funding for this program from the General Fund;

 It authorizes and directs the Department of Labor,
 Bureau of Rehabilitation Services and the State Purchasing Agent to attempt, to the extent practicable, to reduce the service
 charges for wireless communications devices or 2-way pagers incurred by deaf or hard-of-hearing persons eligible for the
 discounts established under the amendment through an appropriate bidding or other procedure to achieve bulk discounts on such
 charges;

4. It directs the Department of Labor, Bureau of Rehabilitation Services to report to the joint standing committee
of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and the joint standing committee of the
Legislature having jurisdiction over utilities and energy matters by January 5, 2007 recommendations for appropriate funding levels
to continue the discount program established under the amendment;

5. It removes a provision currently prohibiting the Public Utilities Commission from requiring contributions to the state
 universal service fund in order to cover amounts currently authorized to be transferred from that fund to the Communications
 Equipment Fund; and



Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill transfers \$60,000 in General Fund revenue in fiscal year 2005-06 and \$90,000 in General Fund revenue in fiscal year 2006-07 to the Communications Equipment Fund within the Department of Labor to provide discounts of up to \$10 per month to a deaf or hard-of-hearing person who has an income of less than 135% of the federal poverty level for any wireless communications device or 2-way pager that is used to receive emergency alerts issued by any state of federal agency.

Allowing the Public Utilities Commission to require additional contributions of \$37,500 to the State Universal Service Fund to fund amounts transferred to the Communications Equipment Fund upon request of the Bureau of Rehabilitation Services within the Department of Labor may increase dedicated revenue to the state universal fund.

Additional costs to the Department of Labor, Bureau of Rehabilitation Services associated with implementing the provisions of this legislation can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
