	2. Rulemaking. The Department of Health and Human Services

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill as drafted would create a significant liability/cost for the Department of Health and Human Services to reimburse providers of MaineCare services for costs incurred during 2005 as a result of delays in payments caused by the implementation of a new MaineCare claims management system (MECMS). While the Department has indicated it is planning to request an appropriation of \$4 million to reimburse MaineCare providers for the interest costs they incurred resulting from MECMS-related payment delays, the fiscal impact of this bill cannot be determined at this time because costs to be reimbursed are not sufficiently defined or otherwise limited.
