	This amendment strikes from the bill certain determinations
30	that the Department of Health and Human Services would need to make in order for a new source of water supply to be approved.
32	The amendment also designates rules to establish a consistent approach to the review of hydrogeological issues and to adjust
34	permit fees as major substantive rules. It also changes the structure of the work group that is formed to study state
36	regulation of groundwater withdrawal and modifies the issues that the work group is directed to consider.
