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44	This bill places limits on the application of pesticides
	near the normal high tide mark for the control of browntail
46	moths. It contains the following limits.
48	1. A person may not apply pesticides using aerial
	application in an area from the normal high tide mark to 1,000
50	feet inland.

- 2. A person may not apply pesticides using a mist blower in an area from the normal high tide mark to 500 feet inland.
- 3. A person may not apply pesticides using a hydraulic rig in an area from the normal high tide mark to 50 feet inland.
