An Act To Expand the Powers of the Stonington Sanitary District

(AFTER DEADLINE)

(EMERGENCY)

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 205.

Presented by Representative PINGREE of North Haven. Cosponsored by Senator DAMON of Hancock and Senator: STRIMLING of Cumberland. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

6 Whereas, the Stonington Sanitary District was formed 6 pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, chapter 11; and

8 Whereas, this legislation increases the number of trustees of the district and expands the territory and the powers of the 10 district; and

Whereas, the purposes of this legislation are to be voted on by the residents of the district at a meeting to be held in June;
 and

16 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 20 safety; now, therefore,

22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. Stonington Sanitary District; expanded territory; additional 24 powers; additional trustees. The Stonington Sanitary District, formed pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, chapter 26 11 and referred to in this Act as "the district," is granted additional powers, rights, privileges and obligations as provided 28 in this Act. All authority and powers of the Stonington Sanitary District as previously granted continue in full force and 30 The board of trustees of the district as presently effect. elected and constituted may exercise all additional powers, 32 rights, privileges and obligations granted by this section in the same manner as currently empowered for the affairs of the 34 district.

Sec. 2. Territory. The district's territory is expanded to include the entire Town of Stonington.

40 Sec. 3. Trustees. The district consists of 7 trustees. Four of the trustees must be residents of the district and reside in households that use the district's services, and 3 trustees must be residents of the district but need not use the district's services.

46 Sec. 4. Powers. In addition to the powers granted the district under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, chapter 11,
48 the district has the authority to implement seasonal rates, the authority to pump out, truck or treat sewage and the authority to finance and operate sand filters and other septic services.

Sec. 5. Existing trustees. The trustees of the Stonington 2 Sanitary District holding office on the effective date of this Act hold office as trustees for the terms for which they were 4 elected, and as each term expires one trustee must be elected by the registered voters of the district at the next annual meeting 6 of the district to serve for a term of 3 years. The additional 8 trustees must be elected at the next annual meeting, one for a term of 2 years and one for a term of 3 years. If a vacancy arises, it must be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. 10

12 Sec. 6. Referendum; emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved only 14 for the purposes of permitting its submission to the legal voters within the district at an election called for that purpose or at 16 a town meeting. The election or the meeting must be held in June 2005.

If the referendum is held at an election, the election
 must be called, advertised and conducted according to the law relating to municipal elections, except that the registrar of
 voters is not required to prepare or the clerk to post a new list of voters.

The registrar of voters must be in session the 3 secular days preceding the election, of which the first 2 days must be devoted to registration of voters and the last day to verification of the list and completion of the records of the session by the registrar. The subject matter of this Act is reduced to the 30 following question:

 32 "Do you favor expanding the territory, increasing the number of trustees and expanding the powers of the Stonington
 34 Sanitary District?"

36 The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

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The results must be declared by the municipal officers of the 40 Town of Stonington and due certificate of the results filed by the clerk with the Secretary of State.

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If the referendum is held at a town meeting, the
 procedures of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section
 2354 apply.

This Act takes effect for all purposes immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters in the district if voting is held at an election or upon acceptance at a town meeting if voting is held at a town meeting. Failure to achieve the necessary approval by a majority of voters at any such election does not prevent a subsequent election or elections from 2 being held for that purpose.

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SUMMARY

This bill authorizes the Stonington Sanitary District to 8 expand its territory to include the entire Town of Stonington, increase the number of trustees and expand the powers of the 10 district.
