An Act To Replace the Interagency Task Force on Homelessness and Housing Opportunities with the Statewide Homeless Council

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#### **SUMMARY**

46 Part A of this bill replaces the Interagency Task Force on Homelessness and Housing Opportunities with the Statewide whose membership is designed better 48 Homeless Council, to coordinate and establish statewide policies on homelessness. This bill specifies that current members of the Interagency Task 50

Force on Homelessness and Housing Opportunities continue to serve out the remainder of their terms as representatives of the regional homeless councils of which they are members.

Part B of this bill corrects cross-references to the Interagency Task Force on Homelessness and Housing Opportunities.

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
