

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment provides a General Fund appropriation to the Department of Administrative and Financial Services of \$50,000 in fiscal year 2006-07 for approximately 500 access aisle signs at a cost of \$100 per sign. This represents the estimated amount needed for the state's own compliance to the requirement in the majority report that all entities with disability parking access aisles have signs.
