HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "C" to H.P. 1224, L.D. 1717, Bill, "An Act To Create Mandatory Minimum Sentences for Persons Convicted of Certain Sex Offenses against Victims under 12 Years of Age"

Amend the amendment by inserting after section 4 the following:

'Sec. 5. 34-A MRSA c. 15, sub-c. 4 is enacted to read:

SUBCHAPTER 4

RESIDENCE AND DOMICILE RESTRICTIONS

§11271. Restriction on place of residence and domicile

A registrant may not establish or maintain a residence or a domicile in a municipality that does not have its own police department or other law enforcement agency that is capable of responding to any call within 5 minutes.'

SUMMARY

This amendment prohibits a person who is convicted and sentenced as a 10-year registrant or as a lifetime registrant under the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act of 1999


