Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

- Sec. 1. 24-A MRSA §2736-C, sub-§1, ¶C-1, as amended by PL 1999, c. 256, Pt. C, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.'

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SUMMARY

48 This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment amends the definition of "legally domiciled" so that a person is required to satisfy 2 of 6 criteria before becoming eligible to purchase

individual health insurance coverage. The amendment also expands the criteria for eligibility to purchase health insurance coverage to include a valid passport or visa, a sworn affidavit declaring a person's intent to reside in this State and a state identification card in lieu of a driver's license.

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The amendment also adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause.

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
