2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §8003, sub-§5, ¶G** is enacted to read:

6 G. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any bureau,  
8 office, board or commission within or affiliated with the  
10 department may issue a temporary license for a period of 6  
12 months and waive all licensing requirements, except for  
14 fees, to any applicant upon a showing of current, valid  
16 licensure in that profession in another state.

14 **SUMMARY**

16 This bill provides statutory authority for all bureaus,  
18 offices, boards and commissions within or affiliated with the  
20 Department of Professional and Financial Regulation to issue  
temporary licenses for 6 months if an applicant is licensed in  
another state.
