2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §1551** is enacted to read:

6 **§1551. Accuracy of information**

8 **1. Accurate records and release.** The State Bureau of
10 Identification shall by rule establish procedures to ensure that
any information maintained by the bureau that is released in
response to a criminal history record check request:

12 A. Is current and valid;

14 B. Accurately identifies the individual who is the subject
of the request; and

16 C. Is released in accordance with law.

18 **2. Rules.** Rules adopted pursuant to this section are
20 routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375,
subchapter 2-A.

24 **SUMMARY**

26 This bill requires the State Bureau of Identification within
28 the State Police under the Department of Safety to establish
procedures by rule to ensure that information that is released as
30 part of a criminal history record check is current and valid,
identifies the correct individual and is released in accordance
with law.
