SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1262, L.D. 1822, Bill, "An Act To Require the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices To Produce a Register of All Registered Lobbyists"

Amend the amendment by inserting after section 4 the following:


'Sec. 5. 3 MRSA §313-A, last ¶, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 691, §11, is repealed.'

Further amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment requires a state employee or a state agency employee who is registered with the commission as a lobbyist to comply with all other requirements that apply to lobbyists under the law regarding other lobbyists.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Repealing the exemption of state employees from certain lobbyist registration requirements will result in those state employees who are registered as lobbyists being required to pay registration fees. Based on the number of state employees who are currently registered as lobbyists, beginning in fiscal year 2006-07, the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices will collect an estimated \$12,000 in annual registration fees as Other Special Revenue Funds revenue. The costs to the General Fund, the Highway Fund and to Other Special Revenue Funds will depend on the funding source used by an agency to pay for the costs of registration fees and can not be determined at this time.
