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20 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1274, L.D. 1834, Bill, "An
Act To Accommodate Victims of Identity Theft"

22 Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting
24 clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the
following:

26 'Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §1317, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1981, c. 610,
28 §8, is further amended to read:

30 **1. Agency procedures for corrections.** A consumer reporting
32 agency shall adopt reasonable procedures to enable a consumer to
correct any inaccurate information in his the consumer's file.
34 For the purposes of this section, "inaccurate information"
36 includes, but is not limited to, materially incomplete
information within the scope of the report requested and
information in the report that is the result of identity theft.'

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SUMMARY

40 This amendment replaces the bill. It clarifies that
42 information contained in a consumer's credit report as a result
of identity theft is considered inaccurate information for
44 purposes of the Fair Credit Reporting Act and is subject to
correction by the consumer reporting agency.
