Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 11 members appointed as follows:

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Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of 1. Senate and 2 members of the House of Representatives 6 the appointed by the Speaker of the House. At least one legislative member appointed must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee 8 on Insurance and Financial Services and at least one legislative member appointed must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee 10 Appropriations and Financial Affairs. Legislative on appointments under this subsection must be representative of the 12 bipartisan interests of the Legislature;

Two members appointed by the President of the Senate,
 one member representing interests of employers recommended by a statewide organization of businesses and employers and one member
 representing hospitals recommended by a statewide hospital association;

Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House, one
 member representing health insurance carriers recommended by a statewide association of health plans and one member representing
 insurance producers authorized by the Superintendent of Insurance to sell health insurance products; and

Three members appointed by the Governor, one member
 representing the Dirigo Health Board of Directors, one member who
 is an employer enrolled in the DirigoChoice program and one
 member representing consumers; and be it further

32 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the first-named House 34 of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 38 effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all 40 appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the Executive Director of the 42 Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission, which must be no later than August 15th; and be 44 it further

Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study alternative models for the Dirigo Health Program in comparison to the current operations of the program, including the formation of a self-administered plan, the establishment of a nonprofit

entity, the use of a voucher system and other models for providing access to health care benefits under the program. In conducting this study, the commission shall for each model:

 Develop a timeline and enrollment goals to reduce and
 eliminate the number of uninsured residents in this State under that model and test the model's viability to meet the timeline
 and enrollment goals;

 Develop projections for the expected funding needs for subsidies annually and sources of funding for subsidies;

3. Estimate anticipated program costs, including premium

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4. Develop a projected budget for administrative costs;

18 5. Evaluate the potential liability of the State, Dirigo Health, health care providers and enrollees in the program in the 20 event of an insolvency;

22 6. Compare the model to similar models used in the private sector and evaluate its financial structure for safety and 24 soundness;

26 7. Evaluate the potential effect of the model on the private market for health insurance in the State; and 28

8. Evaluate the need for additional regulation of the model 30 to ensure consumer protection; and be it further

32 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis and 34 the Office of Fiscal and Program Review shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That legislative members of 38 the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to 40 their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. 42 Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive 44 reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; 46 and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than November 1,
2006, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation,
for presentation to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over insurance and financial
services matters and the Legislative Council. The commission is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the
First Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature at the time of submission of its report; and be it further

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Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That, the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the 12 commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the 14 Legislative Council for its approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding 16 Upon request from the commission, the its approved budget. Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly 18 provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on 20 the commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds; and be it further 22

Sec. 10. Receipt of outside funds authorized. Resolved: That the commission may seek outside funds to fund costs of the commission 24 other than authorized per diem and expenses of the members authorized by section 7. Contributions to support the work of 26 the commission may not be accepted from any party having a pecuniary or other vested interest in the outcome of the matters 28 being studied. Any person, other than a state agency, desiring to make a financial or in-kind contribution must certify to the 30 Legislative Council that it has no pecuniary or other vested interest in the outcome of the study. The certification must be 32 made in the manner prescribed by the Legislative Council. All 34 contributions are subject to approval by the Legislative Council. All funds accepted must be forwarded to the Executive 36 Director of the Legislative Council along with an accounting record that includes the amount of the funds, the date the funds were received, from whom the funds were received and the purpose 38 of and any limitation on the use of the funds. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall administer any funds 40 received by the commission; and be it further

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Sec. 11. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved: That the following appropriations and allocations are made.

SUMMARY

This amendment removes all of the provisions in the majority 20 report and turns the bill into a resolve requiring the creation of the Blue Ribbon Commission To Study Alternative Models for the 22 Dirigo Health Program. The amendment requires the commission to alternative models, including the formation of study self-administered plan, the establishment of a nonprofit entity, 24 the use of a voucher system and other models. The commission is 26 composed of 11 members, including 4 Legislators, a representative of the Dirigo Health Board of Directors and members representing 28 the interests of employers, health insurance carriers, hospitals, insurance producers and consumers. The amendment requires the 30 commission to report to the First Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature and also authorizes the commission to introduce recommended legislation. This amendment adds an appropriations 32 and allocations section.

Legislative Study

The projected costs to fund the general operating expenses of the Blue Ribbon Commission to Study Alternative Models for the Dirigo Health Program are \$2,850 in fiscal year 2006-07. The Legislature's budget includes \$20,000 in fiscal year 2006-07 for legislative studies. Whether that amount is sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature. There is also a base allocation of \$500 in fiscal year 2006-07 in the event that outside funding is received to support the work of the commission.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

By eliminating the provisions in the committee amendment this amendment eliminates the potential costs to the General Fund but adds the costs of the legislative study.
