#### **SUMMARY**

This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. This amendment replaces the bill. It directs the Commissioner of 16 Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to develop an animal 18 identification program and requires rulemaking to establish a system for registering premises where livestock and poultry are 20 kept and for the identification of individual animals and lots of It specifies certain elements to be included in the 22 animals. rules and directs the commissioner to amend the rules to be 24 consistent with any future federal requirements for premises registration and animal identification.
