	<b>1. Selection.</b> To attract and select college students w tion and talent for temporary internships within county l governments;
enth	2. Placement. To place each program intern in a position responsibility where the intern can contribute ide usiasm and ingenuity while completing a project under ction of a responsible county or local administrator;
	<b>3. Liaison.</b> To encourage liaisons between county and lo rnments and the various institutions of higher learn ted within the State; and
outs	<b>4. Recommendations.</b> To formulate recommendations oving the program and for attracting college graduates w tanding potential into permanent positions of employm in county and local governments.

	To be eligible to participate in the program, a student mu
have	1. College. Have completed at least 2 years of college graduated from college within the past year; and
	2. Residence. Be a state resident or attend a college

The program is administered by the Margaret Chase Smith 2 Center for Public Policy within the University of Maine System and is referred to in this chapter as "the center." The center's 4 duties include the following.

 6 1. General supervision. The center shall exercise general supervision over the operation of the program and shall develop
 8 and put into effect administrative guidelines for interns and county and local government personnel, formulate policies and
 10 establish and administer operational procedures.

12 2. Promotion: recruitment. The center shall disseminate widely information and application forms and otherwise publicize 14 the program to attract the attention and interest of as many college students as possible and shall receive the completed 16 application blanks of those students interested, as well as answering inquiries for further details and information. 18

- 3. Participation of county and local governments. The center shall acquaint officials and administrators with the program and its advantages, encouraging the greatest possible participation by county and local government offices.
- 4. Selection. Applications of interested students received by the center must be processed in accordance with procedures to
   26 be established by the center.
- 28 **5.** Placement. The center shall place students with participating county and local government offices.
- 6. Orientation. The center shall arrange an orientation for
   interns and supervising county and local personnel prior to
   commencement of intern work within a county or local government
   office and may conduct special programs during the internship to
   ensure that interns obtain a broad understanding of county and
   local governments.
  - 38 7. Coordination. The center shall coordinate the activities
     of the interns with the various participating county and local
     40 government offices to the maximum advantage of the program.
  - 42 8. Annual report. The center shall produce an annual report, which is a public document, by the end of each calendar
    44 year on the operation of the program. Copies of the report must be filed with the Legislature.

    - §475. Conditions of employment
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  - 1. Temporary unclassified service.Interns are considered50temporary, unclassified employees of the county and local

governments. The employing county or local government office may 2 discharge an intern for cause with one week's advance notice to the intern and the center. The center may reassign an intern or 4 release the intern from the program with one week's advance notice to the intern and the office when it is considered in the б best interest of the program.

- 8 2. Salary. The center shall determine from time to time an appropriate minimum salary for interns, which must be paid by the 10 participating county and local government offices. The center may negotiate the placement of an intern within county or local 12 government and, to further the purposes of the intern program, may make funds from this chapter available to the intern.

- 3. Internship training. Participating county or local 16 government offices shall release intern personnel to participate in paid orientation or training activities planned by the center 18 as part of the internship program.
- 20 §476. Acceptance of gifts, bequests, grants, aid

The center may accept gifts, beguests and endowments for 22 purposes consistent with the objectives of this chapter and may accept federal, private foundation and other grants and matching 24 funds when determined to be in the best interests of the program. 26

This bill creates the County and Local Government Internship 50 Program, administered by the Marqaret Chase Smith Center for Public Policy at the University of Maine, which pairs college-age students with county and local governments. Students must have completed at least 2 years of college or have just graduated from college and must be Maine residents or out-of-state students attending college in the State.
