An Act To Allow Independent Wineries To Serve Wine at Trade Shows

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §1355, sub-§3, ¶E is enacted to read: 4 A holder of a farm winery license may serve Ε. complimentary samples of wine produced at the winery to 6 persons who are not minors at trade shows for the purpose of allowing consumers to taste the wine product at the trade 8 show. For the purposes of this paragraph, "trade show" means an event at which the goods and services of a specific 10 industry are exhibited, such as, but not limited to, a free 12 public wine tasting at a licensed retail store or a restaurant. A holder of a farm winery license may serve 14 complimentary samples of wine on Sunday after the hour of 12:00 noon at trade shows. 16 SUMMARY 18 20 This bill allows farm wineries, those wineries manufacturing less than 50,000 gallons a year, to serve complimentary samples 22 of wine to consumers at industry trade shows.
