16	The amendment provides that in developing materials for training in domestic violence issues, the Maine Criminal Justice Academy may consult with a statewide organization involved in
18	advocacy for victims of domestic violence and with an organization having statewide membership representing the
20	interests of firearms owners.
22	The amendment also provides that a law enforcement officer who receives custody of a firearm pursuant to a protection from
24	abuse order shall exercise reasonable care to avoid loss, damage or reduction in value of such firearm. Any liability for damage
