- 2. To allow the MTC to deliver boatbuilding training at various sites along the Maine 22 coast in order to more fully meet the statewide workforce needs of Maine's marine 23 industry; and
- 3. To subsidize the cost of planning and delivering a statewide expansion of the registered apprenticeship program and customized training of existing workers.
