Sec. 7. Report. 14 The Department of Environmental Protection shall prepare a report on funding for cleanup of sites contaminated by hazardous waste, biomedical waste and waste oil. 16 The report must include an assessment of the adequacy of the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund and must be submitted to the joint 18 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 20 natural resources matters no later than February 1, 2007. The committee may report out legislation dealing with the fees for 22 the transport and disposal of hazardous waste to the First Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature. 24

SUMMARY

28 This bill increases revenue in the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund by adjusting the fees for the transport and disposal of hazardous waste. The bill eliminates the disparity between the 30 fee charged for transport of waste within Maine and the fee another 32 assessed for waste transported into Maine from The bill authorizes the Board of Environmental jurisdiction. 34 Protection to assess a fee for registration of biomedical waste generators. The bill requires the Department of Environmental Protection to prepare a report on the adequacy of the Maine 36 Hazardous Waste Fund and on funding for cleanup of sites contaminated by hazardous waste, biomedical waste and waste oil. 38
