Fiscal Detail and Notes

By establishing an August 1, 2006 deadline by which certain land transactions must be finalized, this amendment reduces the probability that the proposed land transactions will occur. If the deadline is not met the net Other Special Revenue of \$3,023,000 in fiscal year 2006-07 will not occur and the loss of revenue from timber harvesting, \$78,000 annually, will not occur.
