If the commissioner suspends a license, permit or registration pursuant to this subsection, the suspension must be for at least 90 days. The commissioner shall reinstate licenses, permits and registrations that have been suspended pursuant to subsection enly-if after the period of suspension has elapsed and after the person satisfactorily completes, in accordance with procedures established by the commissioner by rule, a training program approved by the department relating to safety and ethics in the operation of ATVs. The costs of this training program are borne by the person undertaking the training. The commissioner shall establish by rule the procedures for completion of mandatory training pursuant to this subsection. A person who satisfactorily completes a training program approved by the department pursuant to this subsection is deemed to have satisfied the outdoor ethics training course requirements established under section 10903. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

It requires the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to suspend for at least one year all licenses, permits and registrations issued pursuant to Title 12, Part 13 for ATV violations involving the abuse of another's property, operating an ATV under the influence under 21 years of age, operating an ATV to endanger, the reckless operation of an ATV or failing to stop for an officer; and
- 5. It creates 4 part-time positions in the Department of Conservation to help with ATV club and trail development and landowner communications.

The bill includes an Other Special Revenue Funds allocation of \$112,956 in fiscal year 2006-07 for the Off-Road Recreational Vehicles Program within the Department of Conservation to establish 4 Recreational Trail Coordinator positions and to provide necessary operational costs.

The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife can administer certain changes regarding ATV license suspensions within existing budgeted resources.
