The Board of Pesticides Control within the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources shall organize and conduct events in May and October of 2007 to collect and dispose of obsolete and illegal pesticides in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 1471-P. The board shall advertise locations and dates for the collection of pesticides. Public notifications and advertising must inform the public that household and agricultural pesticides will be collected.

Beginning in fiscal year 2006-07, the increase of pesticide registration fees will result in an estimated annual increase of \$197,500 in Other Special Revenue Funds revenue collected by the Board of Pesticides Control within the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources. In addition, the board will be able to accomplish the required collections of obsolete pesticides through the use of existing budgeted resources.
