## SUMMARY

23 This amendment, which is the minority report, directs that the rule be amended to 24 provide that the definition of "shorebird coastal feeding area" includes a zone of 250 feet 25 around the feeding area. This change will make the rules of the Department of Inland 26 Fisheries and Wildlife and the rules of the Department of Environmental Protection 27 regarding significant wildlife habitat consistent with each other. The amendment also 28 requires that rules adopted by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife that define 29 habitat for species appearing on the official state or federal lists of endangered and 30 threatened species and high and moderate value travel corridors are major substantive 31 rules.
